Aura (Tinsley) Sanderson is Coming Home

The Chelan native returns to serve her hometown community as a primary care provider

Tuesday, October 16, 2012: Aura (Tinsley) Sanderson is coming full circle. After training as an EMT at Lake Chelan EMS, studying Environmental and Wildlife Biology at Eastern University, and receiving her Bachelor of Science degree in Physician Assistant Studies through <u>MEDEX Northwest at the University of Washington</u>, the Chelan native returns home to practice medicine at Columbia Valley Community Health's Chelan clinic.

Sanderson, a board certified Physician Assistant, has worked for <u>Columbia Valley Community Health</u> (CVCH) since 2005. It was the only job she applied for after graduating from MEDEX Northwest, and seven years later, she is still happy to be practicing with CVCH, and thrilled to be back in Chelan.

"When I started with Columbia Valley, I practiced in Chelan for my first two years" Sanderson says. "Then I was asked to fulfill a role at the Wenatchee Walk-in Clinic, with the long-term intention of practicing family medicine back in Chelan when the opportunity was available."

In September of this year, Jim Larsen, D.O. left the Chelan clinic, after three years, to start his own company, which focuses on covering Emergency Room shifts for several North Central Washington area critical access hospitals. As of October 1, Aura has officially begun working two days a week in Chelan as a primary care provider. She will be taking over Dr. Larsen's existing patient panel and looks forward to establishing a long and beneficial relationship with the community.

"There is something unique about practicing in the community in which you grew up and continue to live," Aura says. "I hope to be a positive and helpful presence in supporting our organization as we work to inspire improved health and wellness."

Sanderson will continue working two days at the CVCH Express Care Clinic in East Wenatchee until she transitions to Chelan for a full time schedule. In addition to providing medical care for her hometown, she looks forward to participating in the community and being a general presence there. She is already scheduled to talk with the Chelan high school medical careers class this month.

"I'm excited to be home again. There are so many ways to support the community and opportunities to be involved in – such as medical support for athletic teams, the <u>Columbia Valley Girls on the Run Program</u>, community education events, and mentoring students from the area high school's medical careers class."

Sanderson also appreciates the strong community connection that accompanies an established family medicine practice in one's hometown.
