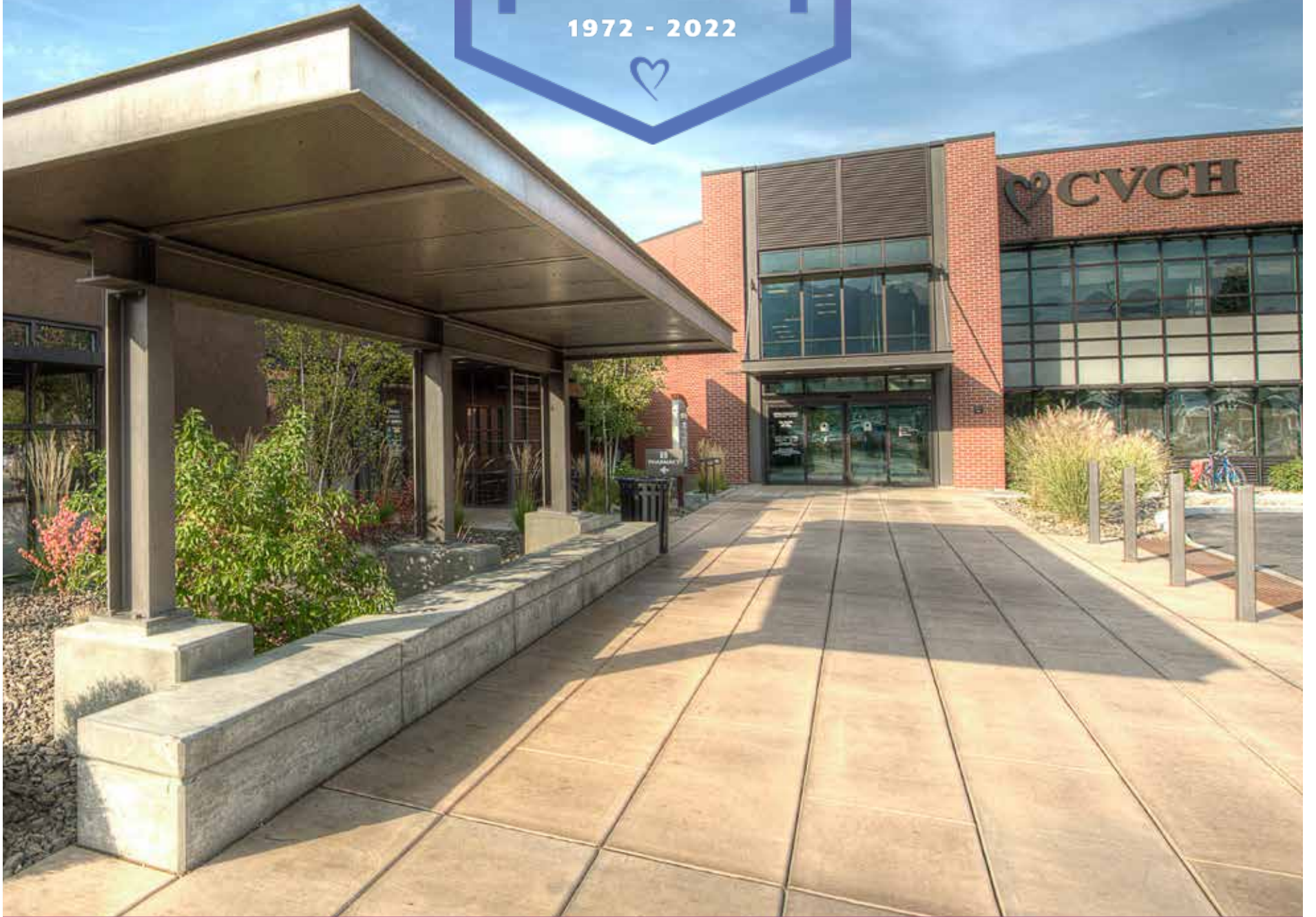

What are we?



CVCH is a Federally Qualified Health Center providing adult and pediatric primary care including urgent care, midwifery, dental, integrated behavioral health medicine, behavioral health, pharmacy, lab, diagnostic imaging, WIC (Women, Infant, Children), nutritional programs, and nutrition counseling services. Other patient support services include education, insurance qualification, and financial assistance. CVCH is accredited by The Joint Commission as a Primary Care Medical Home.



2020 UDS Clinical Quality

The Uniform Data System (UDS) is an annual reporting system that provides standardized information about the performance and operation of federally qualified health centers (FQHC). UDS data informs the public about program effectiveness, helps identify trends over time, and enables comparison with national and state benchmarks.

Below are a few of the CVCH Clinical Quality measures that were included in the 2020 UDS report. Results compare CVCH performance to the state and national average.

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Our History

On January 11, 1972, a group of 24 concerned citizens gathered in a local restaurant with the common desire to find a way to alleviate the poor health conditions of people living in the service area. They voted to create a nonprofit organization known as the North Central Washington Migrant Health Project to address these health care needs.

On April 1, 1972, they received their first grant of \$125,000 to serve Grant, Okanogan, Chelan, and Douglas counties. Early services included screenings by nurses in outreach vans in orchards and along roads. Night clinics were held in borrowed churches and offices by contracting with local physicians.

In the ensuing years, Okanogan and Grant counties became freestanding agencies. The organization's name was changed to Columbia Valley Community Health and



Growth continued that same year with the construction of a new Express Care Clinic at 900 Eastmont Ave in East Wenatchee. This state-of-the-art facility offers same-day services with menu pricing and an advertised patient wait time, which averages only five-minutes.

In 2013 the Pharmacy moved to the main floor at 600 Orondo. This new space boasts almost 3,000 square feet of pharmacy and waiting room areas, allowing for more patient seating and a child play area. In addition to the accessible location next to the Express Care walk-in clinic, it provides a drive-thru window to facilitate prescription pickup.

In 2014, the main campus expanded dental services and added four new dental operatories, to make 12 now in use. Additionally, CVCH started expanding the 600 Orondo site. This same year, CVCH began planning for the launch of the Rural Training Track partnership with the University of Washington Family Medicine Residency. The official program launch was in the summer of 2019. Participating residents spend a year in Seattle where they receive excellent training in the core clinical skills for family medicine, inpatient medicine, ICU care, high risk OB and trauma-based emergency room care before joining CVCH Chelan.

In September of 2015, Stacy Stubblefield, ARNP, CNM, and her business, Riverside Health Center joined CVCH. This addition brought a new midwifery service line to CVCH.



services were expanded with full-time providers and professional facilities. In addition to the medical program, the organization added dental, WIC, and comprehensive maternity support services.

In 1998, CVCH moved to 600 Orondo Avenue where additional space allowed for the expansion of services to include on-site pharmacy, lab services and radiology.

In 2001, the Board of Directors saw yet another need for extended services and voted to expand to the Chelan Manson community. The original CVCH Chelan clinic was located at 317 E. Johnson Avenue and offered medical, dental and WIC services.

In 2005 behavioral medicine was added and in 2014 due to growing demand, two new behavioral health access points were established- CVCH's adult behavioral health and childrens' behavioral health clinics. The adult behavioral health clinic is now located at 504 Orondo Avenue in Wenatchee and the childrens' behavioral health clinic is located on Easy Way in Wenatchee.

In 2011, CVCH embarked on an extensive expansion of the Wenatchee clinic. A 15,000-square foot clinic addition opened 12 new medical exam rooms, a new dental department with eight completely digital dental operatories, and a beautiful new entrance to the main campus at 600 Orondo Ave.



In early 2016, two Wenatchee-based CVCH behavioral health therapists began seeing students in the Chelan and Manson schools a few days each week. In 2017, a full-time psychologist was hired at the Chelan CVCH campus. Today, the Chelan behavioral health team consists of five full-time providers.

In late 2016, CVCH broke ground on the construction of a new clinic in Chelan. CVCH purchased 1.7 acres in the Apple Blossom commercial development to build this new state-of-the-art site. In September of 2017 the new site in Chelan opened, and is home to the 16,000-square foot full-service comprehensive and integrated health center.

In November of 2016, CVCH began providing medical services for the student body and employees of Wenatchee Valley College (WVC). This clinic is housed on the Wenatchee WVC campus in the Van Tassell Center, located at 1300 Fifth Street in Wenatchee.

In January 2018, Columbia Pediatrics, in private practice since the late 1980's, joined CVCH, adding pediatricians to the CVCH staff and deepening the commitment to caring for every member of the communities served.

In February 2019, CVCH partnered with Catholic Charities, which remodeled its existing facility so that CVCH may provide medical services to the organization's clients. During this same year, CVCH launched New Path, a clinic providing outpatient and intensive outpatient addiction counseling services.

With strong leadership and a solid vision, the commitment to caring for every member of the communities served remains strong. We are proud to provide health care for all, regardless of age or income.

We also have a drive-thru window for convenient prescription pickup. Inside the pharmacy, our automation robotics count, bottle, label and cap the most common medications allowing the pharmacy staff to spend more time assisting patients.

At CVCH Riverside, we strive to personalize both your prenatal care and well woman exams to meet patient needs. We provide customized care and encourage you to develop a birth plan that suits your individual needs.

Columbia Pediatrics: 933 Red Apple Road, Suite C

At Columbia Pediatrics, we offer a full range of pediatric care including well-child check-ups, immunizations and sick appointments. Our caring team is committed to providing quality service in a comfortable, safe office setting where children and parents can feel at ease. We also set aside time to equip parents with the tools and resources necessary for the development of healthy children from birth to adolescence.

At New Path, we provide outpatient and intensive outpatient services for adults and youth struggling with substance use concerns, facilitating a process of recovery that is compassionate and holistic.

CVCH Connect is our mobile clinic that we use in partnership with community partners. Its location changes from week to week, and hours vary upon location, depending on what patient need is.

WIC: 502 Orondo

WIC is the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children. It is a food and nutrition program which improves the health and nutrition of pregnant women, new mothers, and young children up to five years of age. WIC is a FREE program that provides nutrition education, nutritious foods and help accessing health care to eligible low-income women, infants, and children.

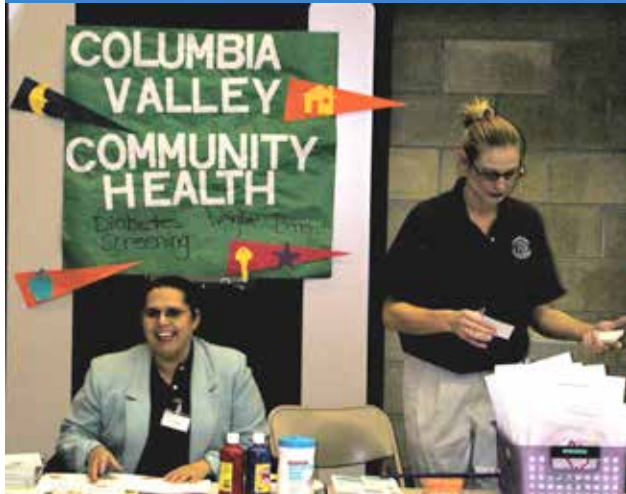

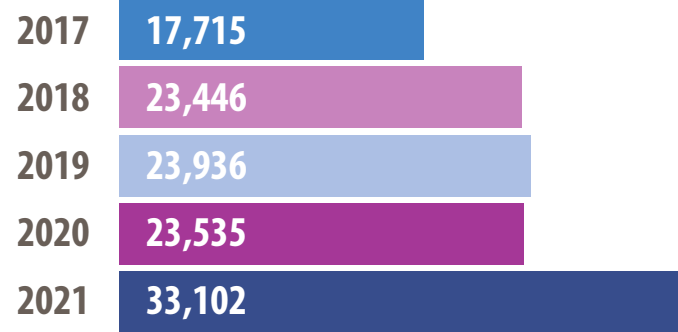


2017-21 Summary of Patient Encounters by Location

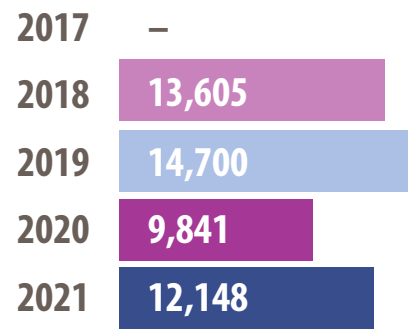

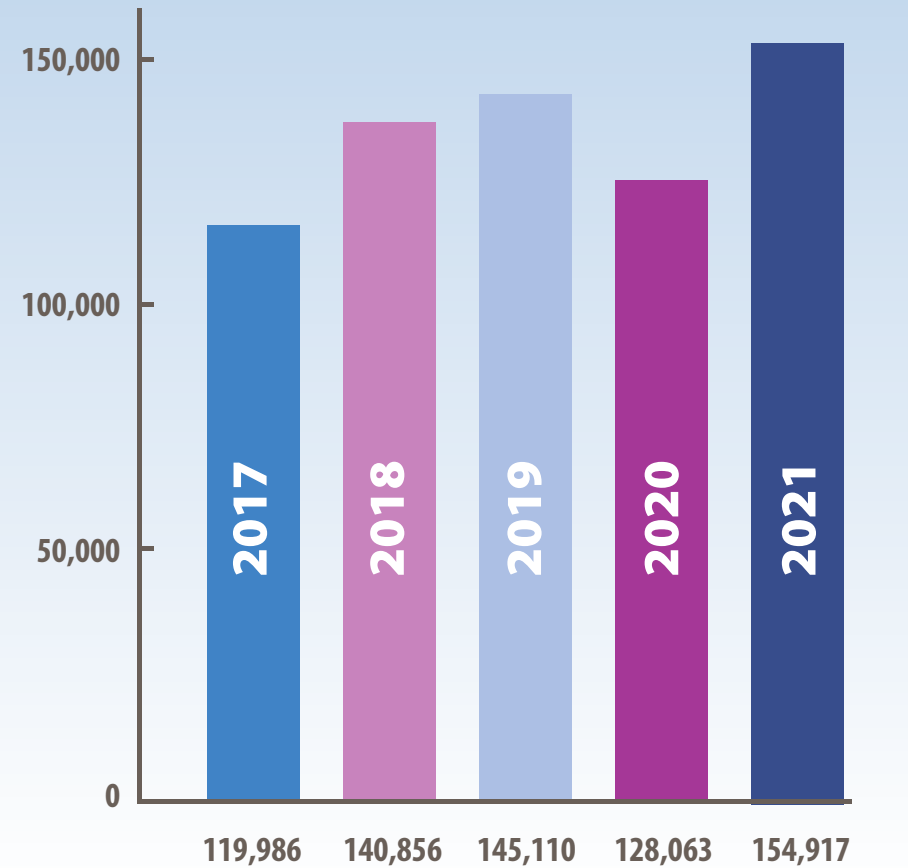

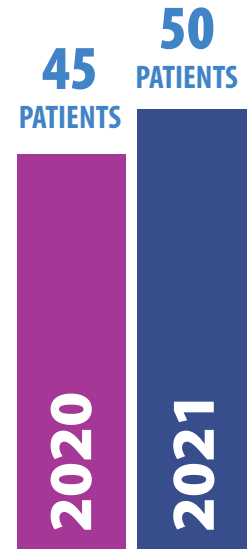


Helping Hands Fund
